#### RF Exposure

#### General Statement on RF energy

Your phone contains a transmitter and a receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your phone transmits.

#### Specific Absorption Rate (SAR)

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines. These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organisation ICNIRP and include safety margins designed to ensure the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health

The guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg and the highest SAR value for this device when tested at the ear was 0.867 W/kg<sup>(1)</sup>. As mobile devices offer a range of functions, they can be used in other positions, such as on the body as described in this user guide.

As SAR is measured utilising the device's highest transmitting power, the actual SAR of this device while operating is typically below that indicated above. This is due to automatic changes to the power level of the device to ensure it only uses the minimum power required to communicate with the network.

#### Body worn operation

Important safety information regarding radiofrequency radiation (RF) exposure.

To ensure compliance with RF exposure guidelines the phone must be used with a minimum of 1.0 cm separation from the body.

Failure to observe these instructions could result in your RF exposure exceeding the relevant guideline limits.

"The highest SAR value for this mobile phone when tested for use at the body and compliance against the standard is 1.08 W/kg. While there may be differences between the SAR levels on various phones and at various positions, they all meet the relevant International guidelines and EU requirements for RF (radio-waves) exposure"

#### General statement on interference


#### 1.1 Set-up

#### Removing or installing the back cover




#### Inserting or removing the SIM card (1)

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. Please power off your phone and remove battery before inserting or removing the SIM card.



Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press it and slide it out.


#### Installing or removing the battery



- Insert and click the battery into place, then close the phone cover.
- Unclip the cover, then remove the battery.


#### Check with your network operator to make sure that your SIM card is 3V or 1.8V compatible. The old 5 Volt cards can no longer be used. Please contact your operator.

#### Installing and removing the microSD card



To release the microSD card holder, slide it in the direction of the arrow and lift it. Then insert the microSD card with the golden contact downward. Finally, turn down the microSD holder and slide it in the opposite direction to lock it.

#### Charging the battery



Connect the battery charger to your phone and mains socket respectively.

- If the battery is flat, it may take around 20 minutes to display the battery charger indicator on the screen.
- Be careful not to force the plug into the socket.
- Make sure the battery is correctly inserted before connecting the charger.
- The mains socket must be near to the phone and easily accessible (avoid electric extension cables).
- When using your phone for the first time, charge the battery fully (approximately 3 hours). The charge is complete when the animation stops.

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To reduce power consumption and energy waste, when battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

### 1.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the  $\bf Power$  key until the phone powers on. It will take some seconds before the screen lights up.



If you do not know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code with your phone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

#### Set up your phone for the first time


The first time you power on the phone, you are prompted to set up your phone in multiple ways: language, input method, mobile data connection, account setup and synchronization, etc.

#### 1.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the Power key from the Home screen until the phone options appear, select **Power off**.

#### 2.1 Keys and connectors

#### 2.2 Home screen

You can bring all the items (applications, shortcuts and widgets) you love or use most frequently to your home screen for quick access. Press **Home** key to switch to Home screen.



Home screen is provided in an extended format to allow more space for adding applications, shortcuts etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view of the Home screen. Small dots at the lower left and right of the screen indicate which screen you are viewing.

#### 2.2.1 Using the touchscreen



To access an application, touch it with your finger.



To enter the available options for an item, touch and hold the item. For example, select a contact in Contacts, touch and hold this contact, options list will then appear on screen.



Place your finger on the screen to drag an object to another location.



Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, images, web pages... at your convenience.

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Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move quicker.

#### 2.2.2 Status bar

From status bar, you can view both phone status (to the right side) and notification information (to the left side). When the status bar is full, " $\Downarrow$ " icon will appear.

#### Notification panel

Touch and drag down the Status bar to open the notification panel. Touch and drag up to close it. From the Notification panel, you can open some functions by touch (Bluetooth, etc.), reminders indicated by notification icons, or view wireless service information.



Touch to clear all event-based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain).

#### 2.2.3 Unlock phone screen

You can drag up the lock icons to unlock the phone screen.



#### 2.2.4 Personalize your home screen

#### Add

Touch and hold an empty area, you can add shortcuts and widgets to the Home screen.

#### Reposition

Touch and hold the item to be repositioned to activate the Move mode, drag the item to desired position, then release. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen page.

#### Remove

Touch and hold the item to be removed to activate the Move mode, touch and hold an empty area which will then turn red, and release, then press the red on the icon to remove.

#### Wallpaper customization

Touch and hold an empty area or press **Menu** key and touch **Wallpaper** from Display settings on the **Settings** screen to customize wallpaper.

#### 2.2.5 Volume adjustment

You can set alarm, media and phone ringtone volume to your preference by **Volume up/down** key, or **Settings** menu.

#### 2.3 Text input mode/character table

There are two text entry methods that can be used to write messages:

- Normal
- Smart

#### Normal

This mode allows you to type text by choosing a letter or a sequence of characters.

#### Smart

This mode can perform predictive input in the keypad.

There are Qwerty and 12 keys keyboard as belows.





## 3 Dialer, Call Log and Contacts

#### 3.1 Dialei



Enter the desired number from keyboard directly or select a contact from **Contacts** or **Call log** by touching tabs, then touch to place the call. The number you entered can be saved to **Contacts** by touching +.

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching .

To hang up a call, touch **End call**.



#### Making an emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial the emergency number and press the 👪 to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code (1).

<sup>(1)</sup> Depends on local regulations.

#### 3.1.1 Answering or rejecting a call

When you receive an incoming call, press the green Accept phone icon to answer.

Hang up the call by touching Reject.

When you receive an incoming call but don't want to answer, you may select "SMS reject" to reject it by SMS.

To mute the ringtone volume of an incoming call, press **\lambda**.



#### 3.1.2 Consulting your call memory

You can access your call memory by touching Application tab from the Home screen and touching **Call log** to view call history in categories of **Missed** and **All**.

#### 3.1.3 Calling your voicemail (1)

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can listen to at any time. To access your voicemail, hold down the table likey.

To set your voicemail number, touch and hold number one on the dial keypad.



To use your voicemail service from abroad, contact your network operator before leaving.

#### 3.1.4 During a call (1)

When a call is in progress, press the Accept to open the call options:

New call Hold the current call and dial another number

**Hold** Hold the current call

Record your current call

**More** Touch to choose notes, conference call or close.

Mute Mute your current call

BT Touch to convert the call voice between bluetooth headset and

phone.

**Keypad** Touch to open the keypad

Move the handset away from your ear while using the **Handsfree** option because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

#### Handling two calls

- Answering a second call (ensure that "Call waiting" is activated, see page 31).
- To call a second party during a call, you can select "New call".

#### 3.1.5 Conference calls (1)

Your phone allows you to talk to several people at the same time (up to five). If you are on a two party call, press "Conference". If a third call comes in, answer it by pressing "Accept" and speak with your new caller.

This caller becomes a member of the conference if you press "Conference". Pressing End Call disconnects the current call.

To end the conference call, press "End call".

Contact your network operator to check service availability.

### 3.2 Call log.....

You can access this function like this:

#### 3.2.1 All calls

The call log shows three different types of call:

Missed calls

Outgoing calls (Redial)

Answered calls

Locate one contact, select press to view call details, press the 📞 key to place a call directly.

#### 3.2.2 Available options

From the call log screen, you can access the following options:

#### 3.2.3 Voicemail

From this menu, you can view all voicemail memory.

For detailed information about voicemail, please refer to page 27.

#### 3.2.4 Call settings (1)

You can access Call settings by selecting "Settings" on the main menu.

#### Available options:

#### Black list

Touch to set auto reject the number in black list. You can add numbers from contact or input directly for white list.

#### White list

Touch to set auto answer the number in white list. You can add numbers from contact or input directly for white list.

#### Auto redial

You can activate or deactivate automatic callback for calls that do not get through the first time.

#### Call time reminder

You can select it to set reminder time.

#### Auto quick end

You can set auto quick end on or off.

#### Auto quick end time

You can set the time from 1-9999 seconds.

#### • Reject unknown number

You can set reject unknown number on or off.

#### Reject by SMS

You can set the function on or off and SMS templates.

#### Connect notice

You can set connect tone when call connected.

#### Auto answer

You can set auto answer when it is in headset mode.

Contact your network operator to check service availability.

#### Additional call settings

#### Hide my caller ID

Hide number/unhide number/decide by network.

#### Call waiting

Activate/deactivate the notification of a second incoming call by a beep.

#### Call forwarding

You can activate, cancel or verify the status of calls forwarded to voicemail or to a specified number. The following configurations are possible:

Unconditional: automatic forwarding of all your calls.

Conditional: if your line is busy, if you don't answer or if you are outside the network range.

#### Call barring

You can activate or deactivate call barring for outgoing and incoming calls. The various options are:

#### 3.3 Contacts



#### 3.3.1 Adding a contact

You can add a new contact by selecting "Add contact".

The following fields are accessible when you create a new entry in Contacts: Name, Number, Email, Address, Birthday, Title, Company, Note, Group, Ringtone and Storage.

#### Adding birthday reminder

You can set a birthday reminder when editing contact information. This will remind you at regular intervals during the day prior to the set date.



If you use your phone abroad, store your Contact numbers in international format: "4" followed by the country code.

#### 3.3.2 Importing, exporting and sharing contacts

From Contacts screen, press **Settings** key to open the contacts settings option menu, touch **Import/Export contacts**. From here you can exchange contacts between Phone and SD card; Phone and SIM card.

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, SMS, Email, etc.

Touch a contact you want to share, touch **Share** from Local screen, then select the application to perform this action.

#### 3.3.3 Synchronizing contacts in multiple accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronized from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your phone.

#### 3.3.4 Consulting your contacts

You can access this function from the main menu screen by selecting "Contacts".

#### Searching for a contact

You can search for a contact by entering the initial of their name. Subsequent letters may be added to refine the search.

#### Viewing a contact

Select a name from your contacts, then touch it to read the contact details.

#### Making a call

Locate the name you want to call, then press ...

If several numbers are associated with the name to be called, you must first choose the number from the list (Mobile, Work, etc.), and then press to make the call.

## 4 Messaging, Email

#### 4.1 Messaging.....



You can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS with this mobile phone.

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations and sounds to other compatible mobiles and e-mail addresses.



The MMS function can only be used if the service is provided by your operator, if your contract includes the MMS option and if all the parameters for MMS have been entered.

#### 4.1.1 Write message

On message list screen, touch **New message** to write text/multimedia messages.



#### Sending a text message

Enter mobile phone number of the recipient on **To** bar or touch \_\_\_\_ to add recipients, touch **Tap to compose** bar to enter the text of the message. When finished, touch **Send** to send the text message.



An SMS of more than 160 characters will be charged as several SMS. Specific letters (accent) will also increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

#### Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, Emoticons, slides and sounds to other compatible mobiles.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides, etc.) are attached or Subject added.

#### 4.1.2 Available options when writing new SMS/MMS

Send Send the message you drafted
Save Save current message as draft

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# Q5. Handset cannot power on or power on with strange behavior, such as can not charge, charge abnormally, unlock the screen when you forget the screen unlock pattern, and etc ...
